4	<p>Committee Goals and Project for coming year:</p> <p>4.1 Harm reduction/naloxone training</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Want to continue this initiative this year. In Lethbridge, they opened up first site with inhalation site. Allison went and spoke to Executive Director there- she would be willing to talk about the process and how well this inhalation site has been doing/self-injection site. Last week, Tessa and Jessica brought up some ideas about the sites. Possible presentation by executive director.             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- May or June</li> </ul> </li> <li>- Naloxone training: Most of the provinces now have naloxone kits at pharmacies. Limited research about what is available in the territories.             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Victoria: No kits (both nasal spray/needles) in rural Ontario for first responders</li> <li>- Want to seek more information for other provinces/territories. Jayden would recommend that if you are going to do literature review, incorporating survey for nursing faculty and nursing students on what already exists.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Partnership with CINA and their position with CASN to be discussed.             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Literature review of why Indigenous health should be incorporated into every school's nursing curriculum.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p>4.3 Blood Drive</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Possibility to organize this for nationals or regionals. Research shows January is when they need it most. Needs to be approved by EC.</li> <li>- Jayden talked to Wesley, our Conference Director, prioritized this initiative.</li> </ul> <p>4.4 Homelessness/housing first</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Logan brought up this idea but he is not able to make it today. Allison would like to go through what position and resolution statements have been made. Victoria and Allison to bring up at the May BOD meeting the idea of better accessibility of the statements on the website.</li> </ul> <p>4.5 Other</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Jayden: Violence in nursing is a huge problem. Idea of small campaign on nursing student violence and addressing the problem.
